- 1 warning > noho tūkou > minutes not taken > hui closed
- Papakāinga Trust is developing a Code of Conduct to keep our people and kaupapa safe

# ROAD TO RECONCILIATION

## Results



- 166 respondents answered this question.
- Of these 88.5% (146) were supportive and 59.6% (99) were fully supportive.
- 12.12% (20) respondents were not supportive and 4.2% (7) fully disagreed that the apology would add value to the Reconciliation process.

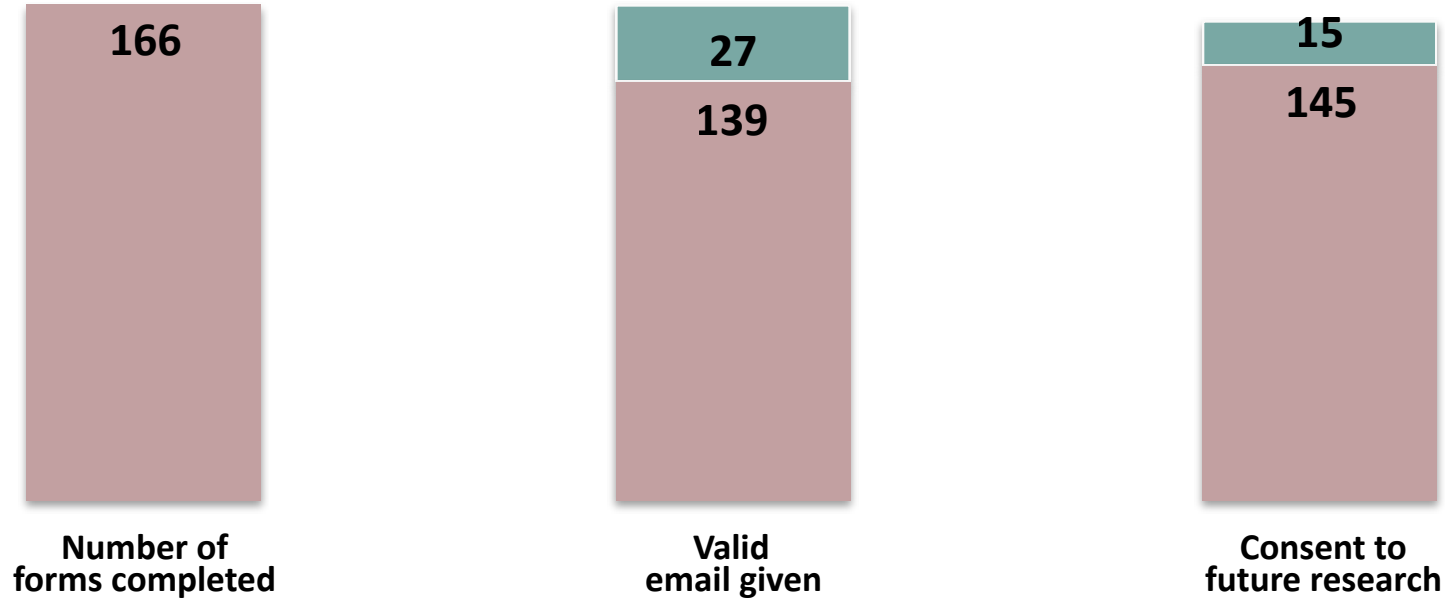

# PARTICIPATION IN FEEDBACK SURVEY

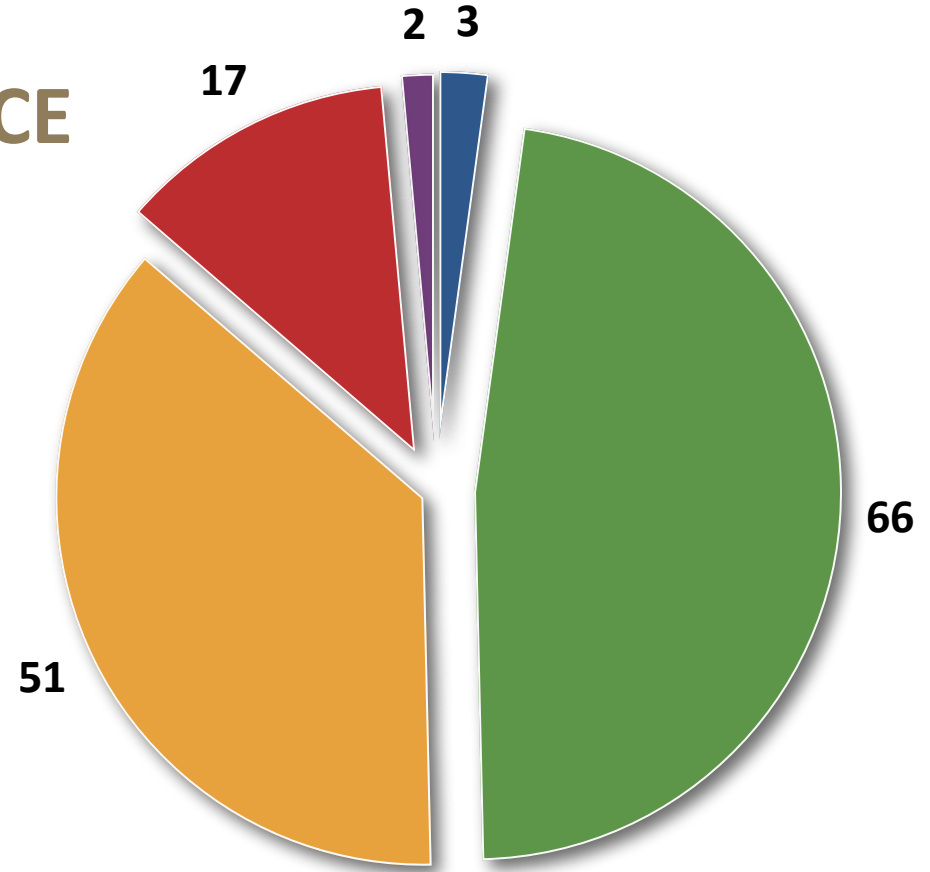




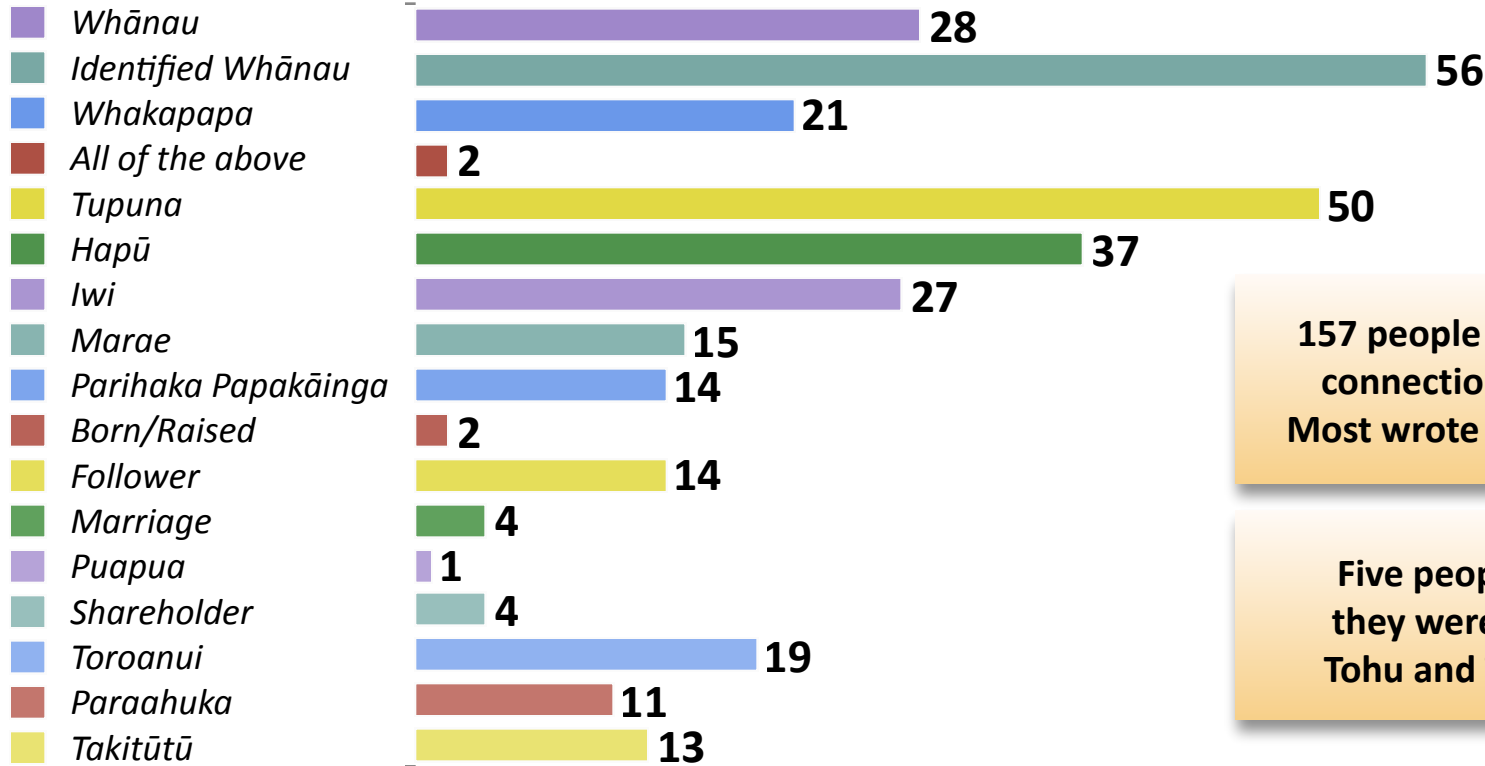

**157 people identified their connection to Parihaka. Most wrote more than one.**

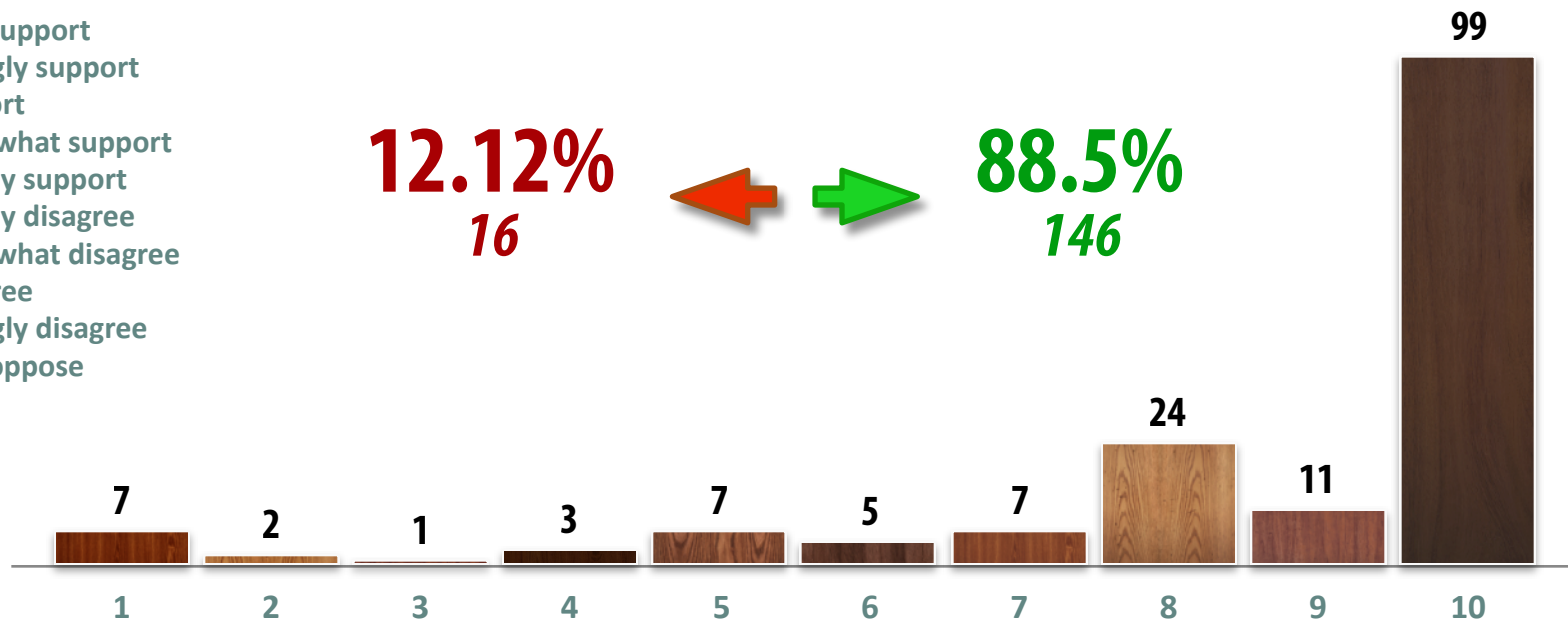

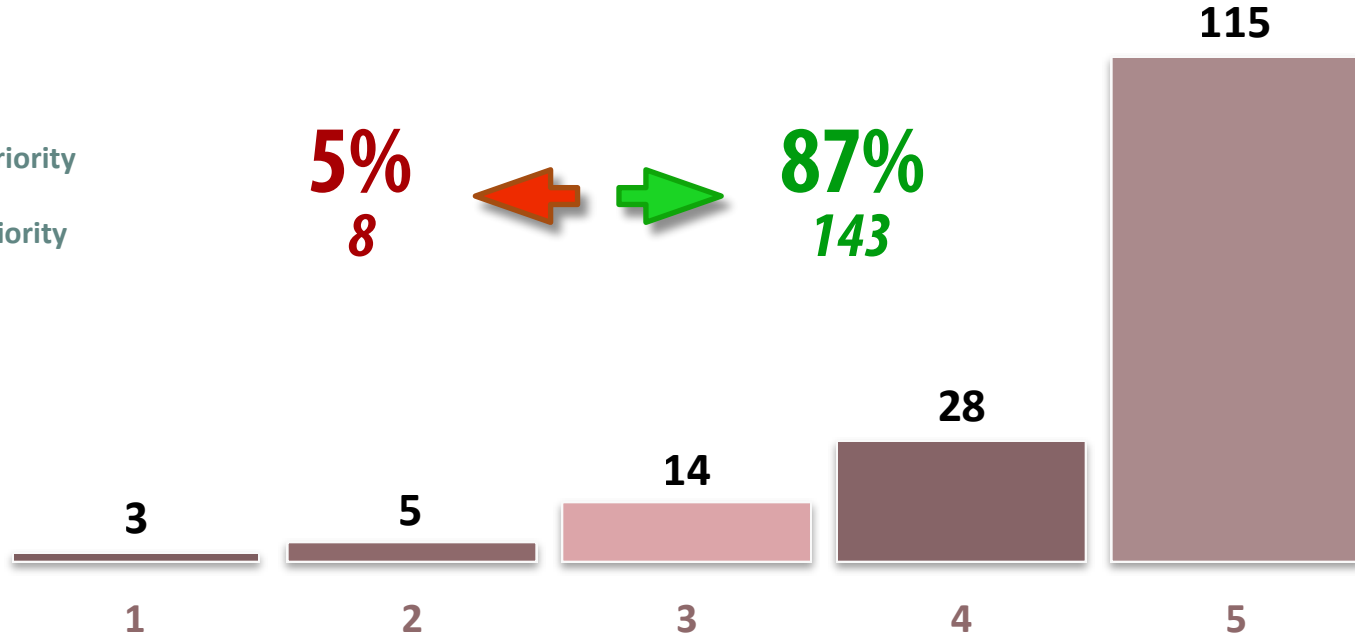

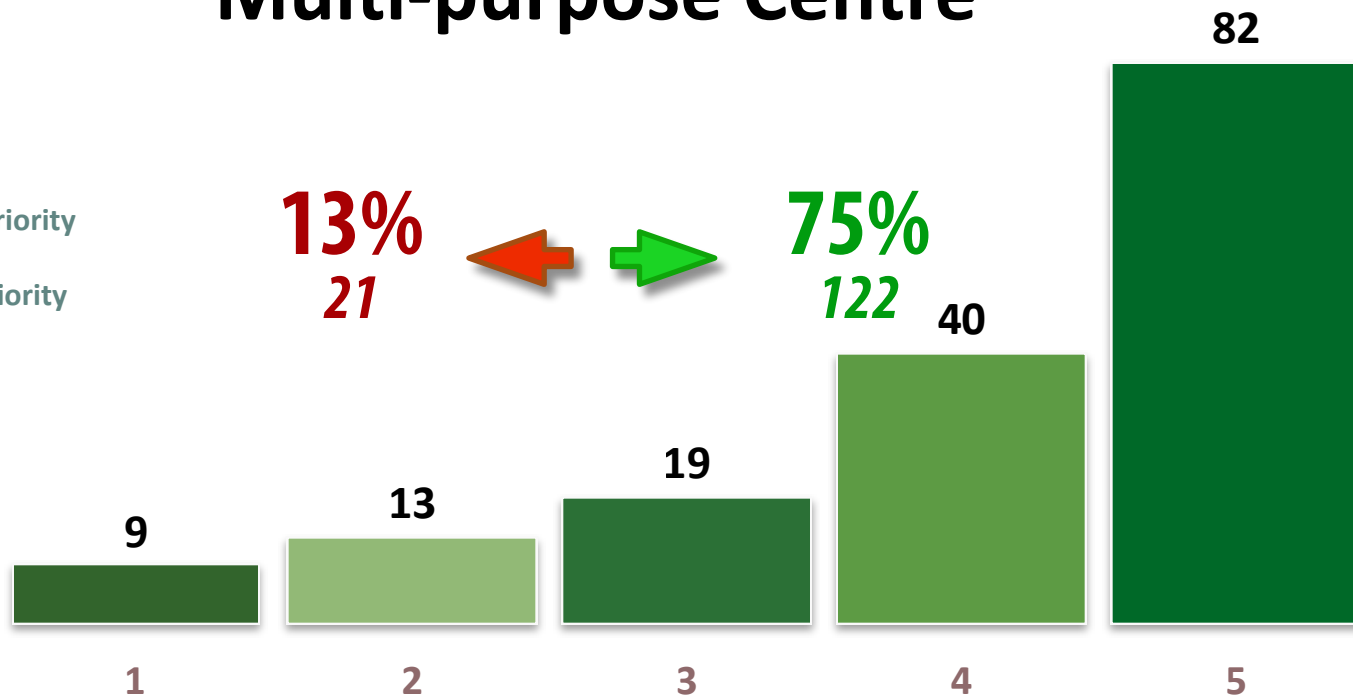

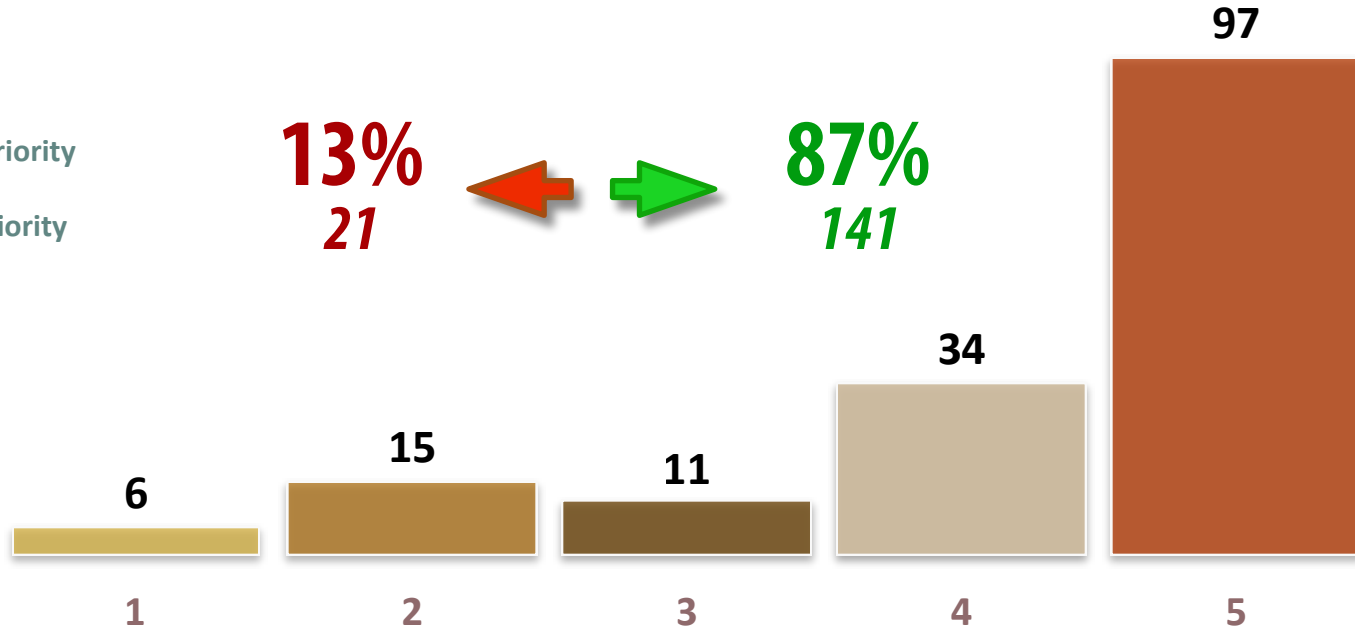

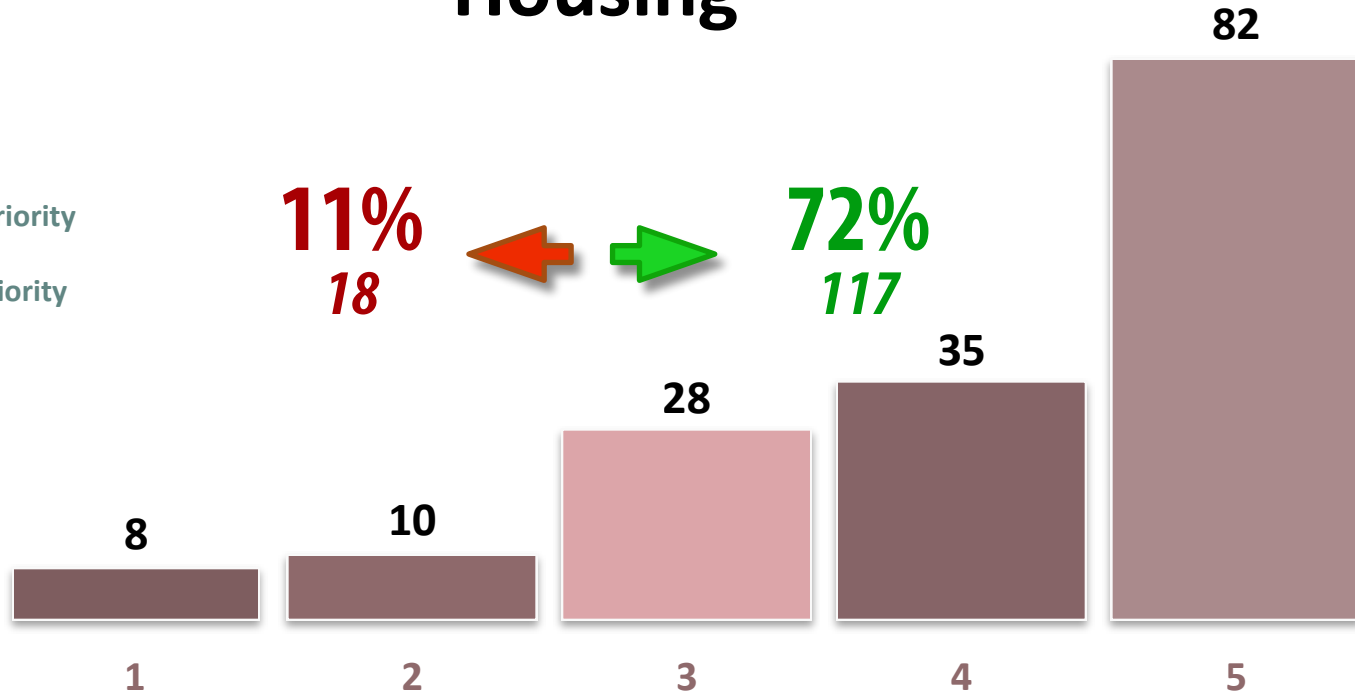

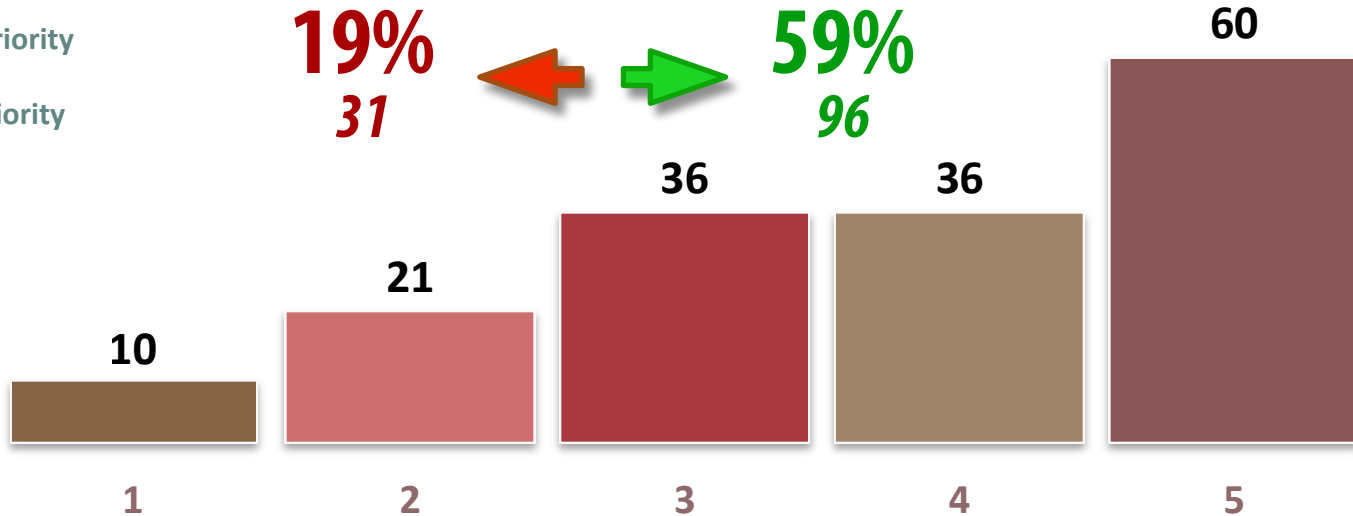

## 6. Should Parihaka enter into a Relationship Agreement with Crown agencies and ongoing development projects?

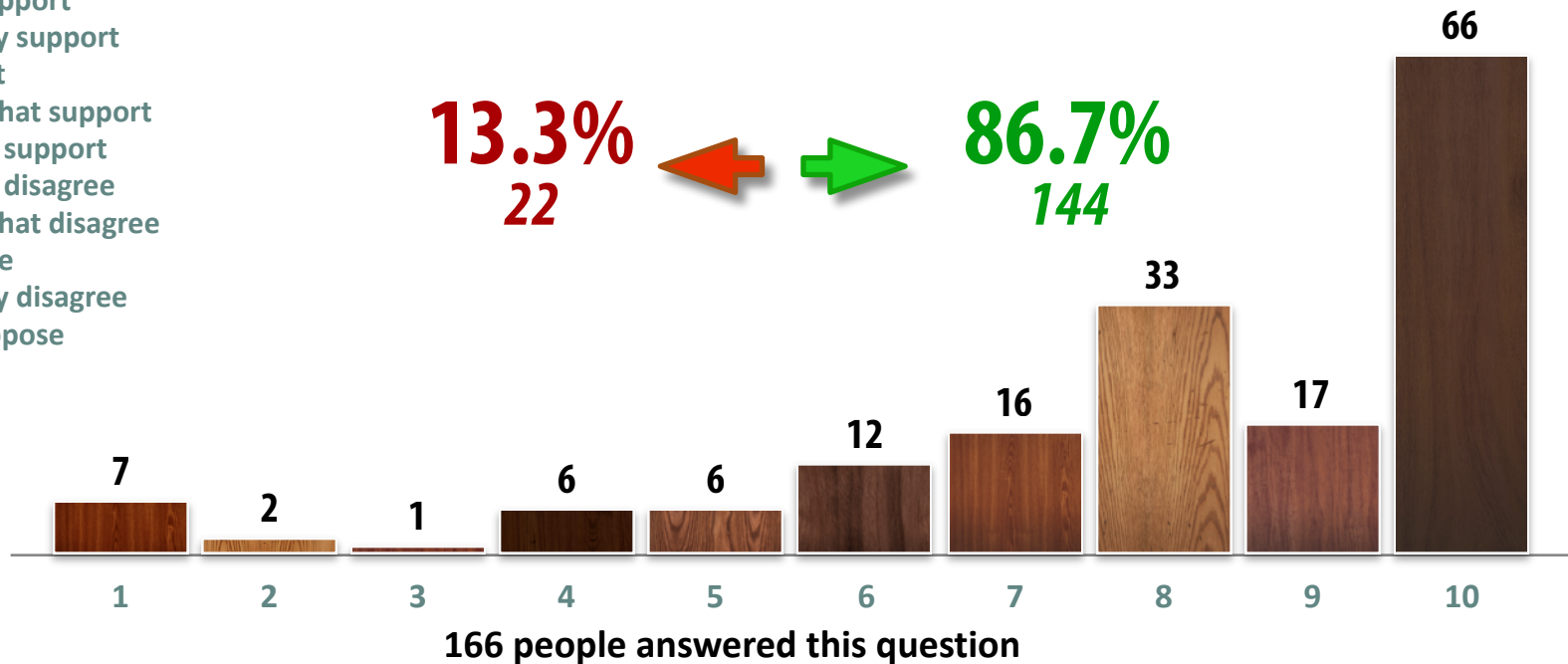

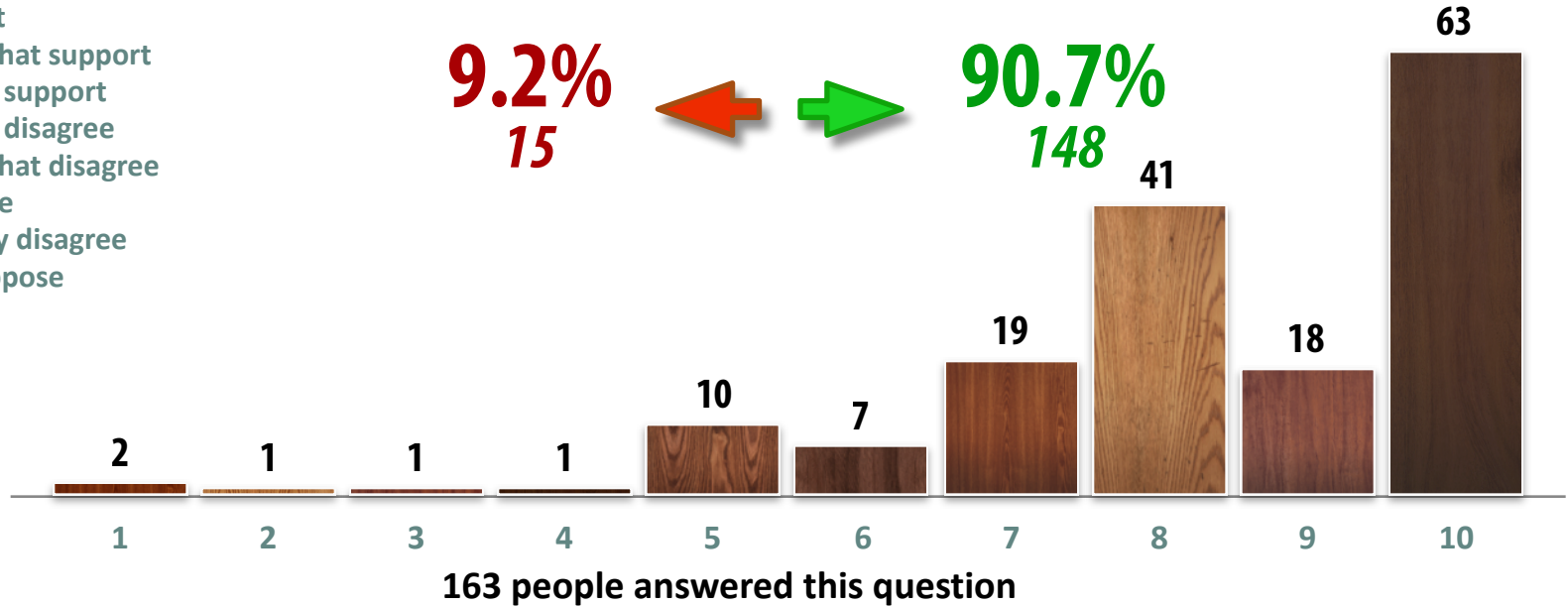

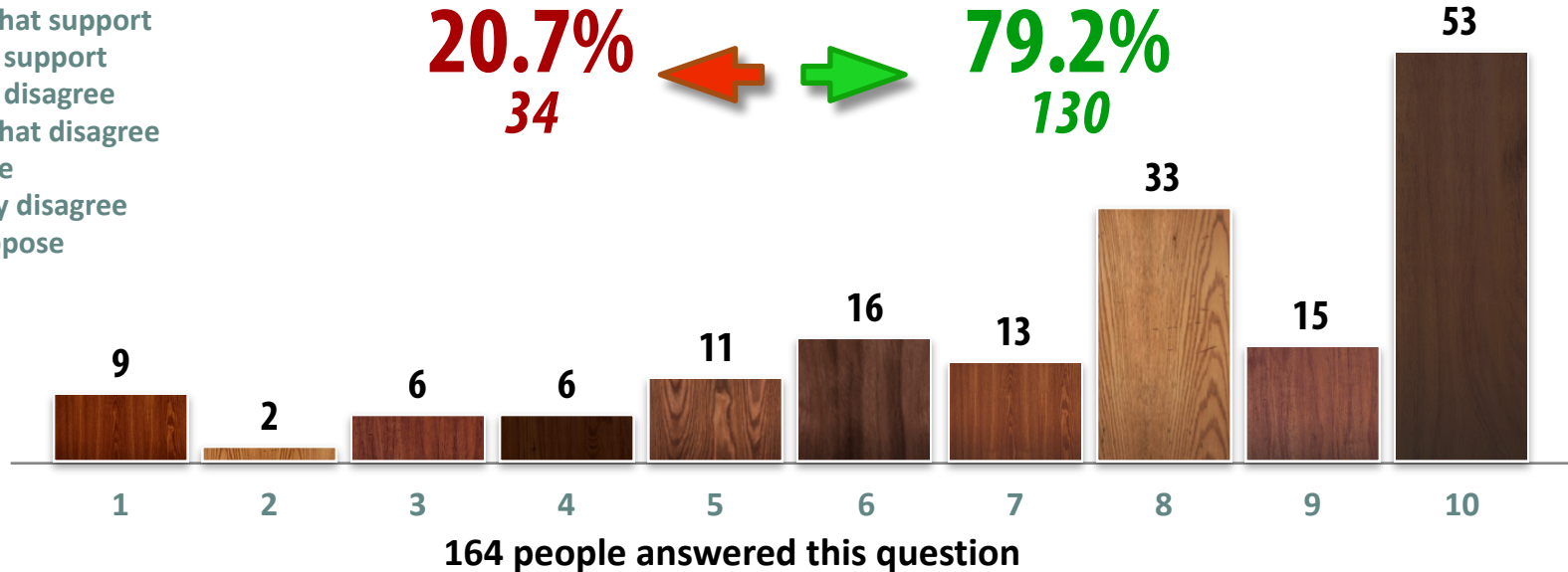
