"Submit a report to the Attorney-General and the Minister for Maori Development as a basis for Government consideration of potential support for the Parihaka community"















The feedback period ends and analysis of the survey are collated



- · 166 respondents answered this question.
- Of these 88.5% (146) were supportive and 59.6% (99) were fully supportive.
- 12.12% (20) respondents were not supportive and 4.2% (7) fully disagreed that the apology would add value to the Reconciliation process.






PARTICIPATION IN FEEDBACK SURVEY





"There needs to be consideration of what an apology will actually achieve"




"Tohu and Te Whiti would never forgive"

"The legacy statement must not be soiled by OTS negotiations and must not be sanitised"



Do you support securing approximately 180 acres for the future development needs of Parihaka?











6. Should Parihaka enter into a Relationship Agreement with Crown agencies and ongoing development projects?




Does Parihaka need to review its current organisational structure?




